. He has become known for coining the neologism solastalgia

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Solastalgia

Solastalgia is a <u>neologism</u> coined by the Australian philosopher Glenn Albrecht in 2003 with the first article published on this concept in 2005.

[2] It describes a form of psychic or existential distress caused by environmental change, such as mining or climate change

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As opposed to nostalgia - the melancholia or homesickness experienced by individuals when separated from a loved home - " solastalgia" is the distress that is produced by environmental change impacting on people while they are directly connected to their home environment. A paper published by Albrecht and collaborators focused on two contexts where collaborative research teams found solastalgia to be evident: the experiences of persistent drought in rural

New South Wales

(NSW) and the impact of large-scale open-cut coal mining on individuals in the Upper Hunter Valley of NSW. In both cases, people exposed to environmental change experienced negative effects exacerbated by a sense of powerlessness or lack of control over the unfolding change process.

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Conceptualising environmentally-induced distress as mental illness has been discussed by Seamus Mac Suibhne. [4]
